

## Interpretation

Interpretation of a site begins with the landscape design which considers landscape context, views and sight lines as well as sound and seasonal change. These elements will ultimately frame the user's experience and their understanding of the site.

The success of projects often relies on community engagement, and we have developed a range of interpretation strategies to foster understanding of the site design.

We have designed a number of interpretive signs to encourage understanding of natural processes. This is a key component of Australian wetland and river restoration projects where water levels are likely to fluctuate and may even dry up during summer periods.

We have also designed interpretive signage which draws on local stories to provide an insight into the unique history of particular place. By drawing on local histories we are able to connect visitors with the current community, providing a window into each place, its people and their stories.
