



Stanhope Hub Revitalisation

The Concept Plans developed for Stanhope provide a conceptual framework to assist in revitalising the local economy and aim to enhance the appeal of the town to prospective new residents and visitors.

The Plans have been developed to make the most of the assets Stanhope already has. Proposed designs retain existing features wherever possible with simple interventions to enhance Birdwood Terrace, McEwan Place and the 'Travellers Stop' area in Brudenell Street.

Works can be undertaken in stages as funding becomes available. Simple, uncluttered design has been used, drawing on local resources and natural materials which will age well.

This project was developed in collaboration with the community of Stanhope.

The original layout of Stanhope, with Birdwood Terrace in a crescent shape to the north of the Midland Highway, ensures that through traffic doesn't cut through the centre of town. McEwan Place sits centrally within the crescent of Birdwood Terrace. The original layout of the railway line on the western boundary of Birdwood Terrace completed the classic town layout of its era.
